

RIVER SAFARI TRAIL 2016

On 15th and 22nd February this year, the Primary 1 pupils embarked on a learning journey to the River Safari to learn more about animals and the environment. They were guided by their P6 Wildlife buddies who helped them to complete a River Safari Trail booklet during the trail.

The P6 Wildlife buddies played the role of teachers and shared information on



various animals located at the iconic river stops. The highlight of the trail was the Giant Panda Forest where pupils met giant pandas, KaiKai and Jia Jia, who live in a climate-controlled biodome.



Due to the dwindling number of pandas left in the world, pandas have become the symbol for wildlife protection and conservation. Besides seeing the pandas, pupils also found out more about the pandas' diets and behaviour patterns.



They also saw the rare red pandas and got up close to other exciting animals such as the chameleon and the giant manatees housed in the world's largest freshwater aquarium.
