Please take note of the information for this year:

A. ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS

1. Arrangements for 2020 School Hours

The school hours for 2020 are from **7.30am to 1.30pm from Monday to Friday**.

We would like all students to be on time for school every day. All students must attend the flag raising ceremony at 7.30am on school days. We have arranged the following pre-assembly activities which start at 7.20am daily to engage the students who arrive early in school.

For activities after school hours, such as Support Programmes (P3 to P6), Learning Support Programmes (P1 & P2), Enrichment Programmes and CCAs, students are to assemble in the Hall after their lunch. Teachers / Instructors will take them from the Hall to the respective venues for the programmes / activities.

2. Meet-the-Parents Session (Primary 2 to Primary 6) – Non School Day

With the start of 2020, we would like to share our school's direction with all parents/guardians so as to help parents/guardians understand our school's future goals. The Principal, Year Heads (YHs), Form / Co-Form Teachers will be meeting the parents/guardians of Primary 2 to Primary 6 students on Tuesday, 14 January 2020. Hence it would be a **non-school day for all Primary 1 to Primary 6 students**.

Parents will know more about the programmes, expectations for each subject area, curriculum and assessment matters and Form / Subject (Co-Form) teachers will carry out a class dialogue session with parents. We hope to see you during the session. Details have been sent out via Parents' Gateway.

We have sought the permission of the Parish Priest at St Joseph's Church (SJC) for the use of their car park. Parents/guardians may park their cars at the **designated lots** at the SJC carpark. As there are limited parking lots, parking will be on a first-come-first-served basis. Please note that no indiscriminate/illegal parking is allowed. Kindly also note that drivers park at their own risk and the church will not be responsible for any damage. We encourage you to take public transport to school for this session.

3. Updating of Students' particulars (Primary 2 to Primary 6)

We will also be asking parents of Primary 2 to Primary 6 students to update your child's particulars on that day. The form will be issued by the Form Teacher on Tuesday, 14 January 2020. Parents who are unable to attend the session will be given the form to complete. Please return the form to the Form Teacher by Friday, 17 January 2020.

4. Safety of our Students and Traffic Management at CHIJ OLQP

The safety and well-being of our students, staff and stakeholders are of utmost importance. We seek the cooperation and support of all pedestrians, drivers/motorists entering our school compound to observe safety for self and others especially during arrival and dismissal times. We seek your understanding and cooperation to adhere to the directions and advice given for better traffic management and safety of all users. **Please refer to Annex 1 (attached) for important information for the Safety of everyone at CHIJ OLQP.**

5. Class Parent Liaison

In order to establish a stronger working relationship with parents, the school and Parent Support Group (PSG) have worked collaboratively to appoint a class parent in each class to better support parents on school and class related matters. A letter will be sent out to all parents about the class parent liaison by the PSG.

B. STUDENT MATTERS

1. Virtue of Responsibility

We have been teaching our students to exercise the virtue of responsibility and self-discipline in looking after their belongings. We encourage parents to assist us in helping your girls to learn that they have to bring their own belongings to school. Thus, if your child/ward has called you to help bring her belongings to school, please refrain from doing so. This will allow you to instil the virtue of responsibility in your child/ward.

We would also like you to note that students are not allowed to call their parents/guardians during curriculum time. Calls can only be made during recess or after school. We would like to discourage parents/guardians from calling the General Office to pass messages to your child/ward. In the event of an emergency or a matter concerning your child's/ward's well-being, the teacher or an administrative staff will contact you.

2. 2020 HOMEWORK POLICY

The Homework Policy aims to help students establish a healthy balance between commitments in school, after school and at home. This would also strengthen the home-school links by reaffirming the role parents and care-givers play as partners in education.

GENERAL GUIDELINES ON DAILY HOMEWORK

The school seeks to ensure students' wellness by not overloading students with homework assignments. It adopts the following guidelines to manage the workload of students. The school and teachers have worked out an estimated amount of time that students would spend to complete their homework assignments daily, based on an average child's ability.

Level	Estimated Time Spent on Homework Daily
P1	30 minutes (emphasis on reading)
P2	30 minutes to 1 hour
P3	1 hour to 1 hour 30 minutes
P4	1 hour to 1 hour 30 minutes
P5	1 hour 30 minutes to 2 hours
P6	1 hour 30 minutes to 2 hours

Students who are unable to finish the work set in class will also need to complete it at home. In addition, students may be tasked to read some materials or write a journal at home. This should not be more than twice a week.

3. Well-Being of Students

We encourage all students to maintain a high standard of personal hygiene and to wash their hands with diligence. We would like to remind parents/guardians that if students are unwell and are showing flu-like symptoms, they should see a doctor and come to school when they are certified fit by the doctor. We encourage parents/guardians to provide the children/wards with a 'wellness pouch'. Items in this pouch could include their thermometers, tissue paper or wet wipes.

4. Travelling during Term Time

We would like to urge all parents/guardians to commit to the academic terms so as to enable your child/ward to immerse themselves with the learning (academic, physical, aesthetics, social, moral and emotional) and experiences that will help build their foundations in their primary school years.

If you would like to make travel plans for your families, there are scheduled school holidays and public holidays to guide you in your plans. We would appreciate that parents/guardians do not make travel plans during the school term. This would help impart in your child/ward the virtues of responsibility, discipline and commitment. Please refer to the school calendar attached.

5. Anti-Idling Engine Regulations

Based on the media advisory released by NEA, parents who are waiting to pick their children from school need to switch off the engines of their cars while waiting. Through collective efforts by the school and NEA, we hope that in the new year, parents will continue to comply with the anti-idling engine regulations. Let us continue to work together to safeguard the public health of our students and our loved ones.

6. Temperature Taking on Thursday, 16 January 2020

As part of the measures to maintain schools' preparedness to resume temperature-taking regime, as well as to ensure that all new students are familiar with temperature-taking, there will be a temperature-taking exercise conducted on **Thursday, 16 January 2020** by the school. In preparation for the exercise, we will be conducting a pre-exercise check on Oral Digital Thermometers (ODTs) on **Monday and Wednesday, 13 & 15 January 2020**. We would like to seek your assistance in ensuring that your child/ward brings her personal ODT on the three days mentioned. ALL P1 students and International students new to the school will be issued their first ODT FREE. All the other students should purchase a new ODT from the pharmacies, supermarkets or school bookshop if their ODTs are missing or are no longer working.

7. Birthday Celebrations in school

We seek the understanding and support of all parents/guardians to note that birthday cakes are not to be brought to school for birthday celebrations. This is for the safety and well-being of our students as we note that some students may have food allergies e.g. dairy products and nuts. Please also do not give out goodie bags or other food items to your child's/ward's classmates. Our teachers will celebrate your daughter's/ward's birthday by getting her classmates to sing a Birthday Song for her on her birthday.

C. CURRICULAR & CO-CURRICULAR MATTERS

1. Religious Education / Catechism Classes (for Catholic students)

As in the past, the school will be conducting Catechism classes for Catholic students in all levels with the help of the Sr Joan, church volunteers and teachers. These lessons are aimed at helping students live the gospel values in their daily lives. Parents are reminded that Catholic students will need to attend Catechism classes in their respective parishes, as the Programme in the parishes specifically prepares children for the sacraments.

If your child/ward is a non-Catholic but you would like her to attend Catechism Classes or Catholic events and activities, you may obtain a request form from your child's/ward's form teacher.

2. PAL for Primary 1 & Primary 2

PAL stands for Programme for Active Learning. It consists of modules of activities in the 4 domains, Sports & Games, Outdoor Education, Performing Arts (Music and Dance) and Visual Arts, which are carried out within the curriculum for all Primary 1 and 2 students.

3. SWIMSAFER National Swimming and Water Safety Programme for Primary 3, 2020

For the seventh year, the school will be having the **SwimSafer Programme at the Senja-Cashew Swimming Complex** during school hours on Mondays and Fridays, for eight 1h 30 min sessions, as part of our PE Programme.

The objective of this programme is to teach basic swimming skills and knowledge of aquatic safety. This enables students to be aware of safety in an aquatic environment. The coach to student ratio is **1:10**. This 8-session programme is fully subsidised and it includes test fee and the admission charges to the swimming complex for your child. Your child will receive a certificate upon completion of the programme.

4. CCA and Support & Enrichment Programmes

CCA sessions will begin on the **third week of Term 1, (Tuesday, 21 January 2020)**. More information to the girls concerned will be sent out in due course.

Support & Enrichment Programmes for Primary 3 to Primary 6 will also begin on the **third week of Term 1 (Monday, 20 January 2020)**. More information will be given to you via the Year Heads.

1. Schedule of Events for Semester 1 & 2

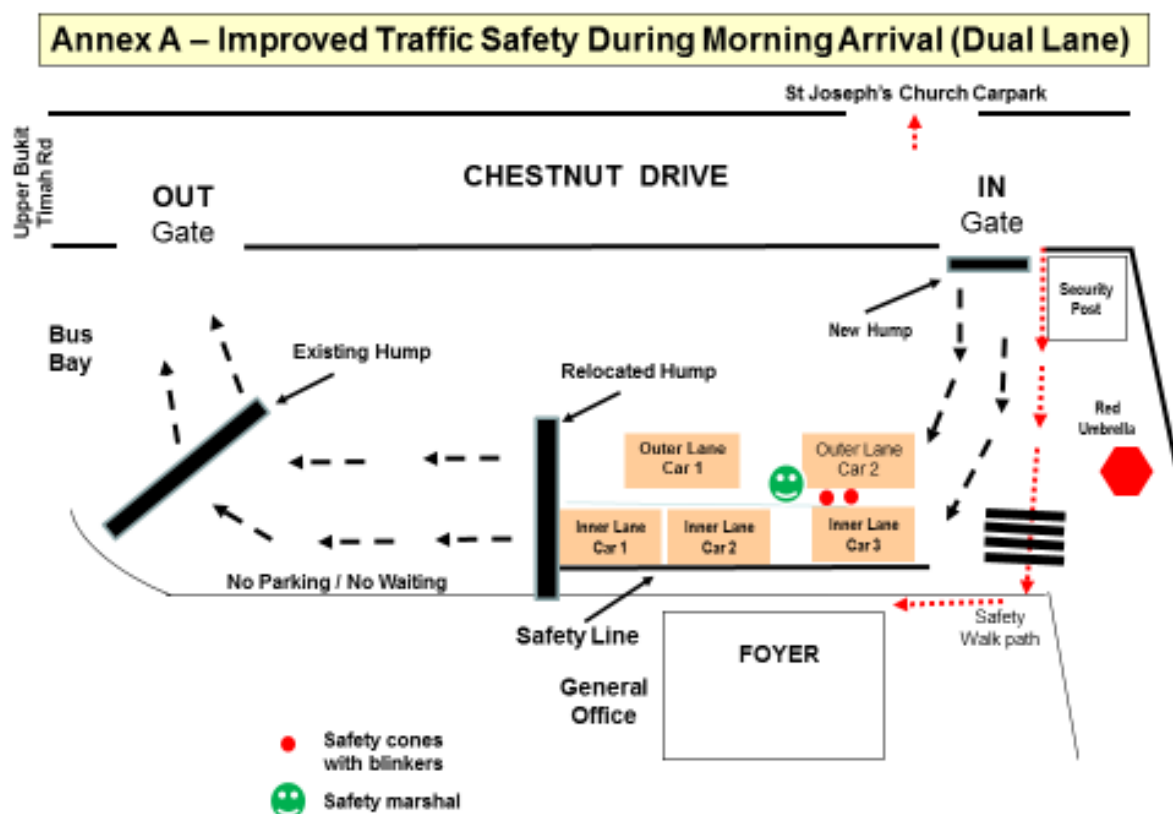

ROAD SAFETY AND TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT AT CHIJ OUR LADY QUEEN OF PEACE AND ALONG CHESTNUT DRIVE

Our thanks and appreciation to the parents/guardians who have been supportive of our efforts to put the safety and well-being of our girls as our top priority. We thank you for your invaluable contribution in making traffic flow at our school smooth and ensuring the safety of the girls, our staff and including yourselves at the daily arrival and dismissal times.

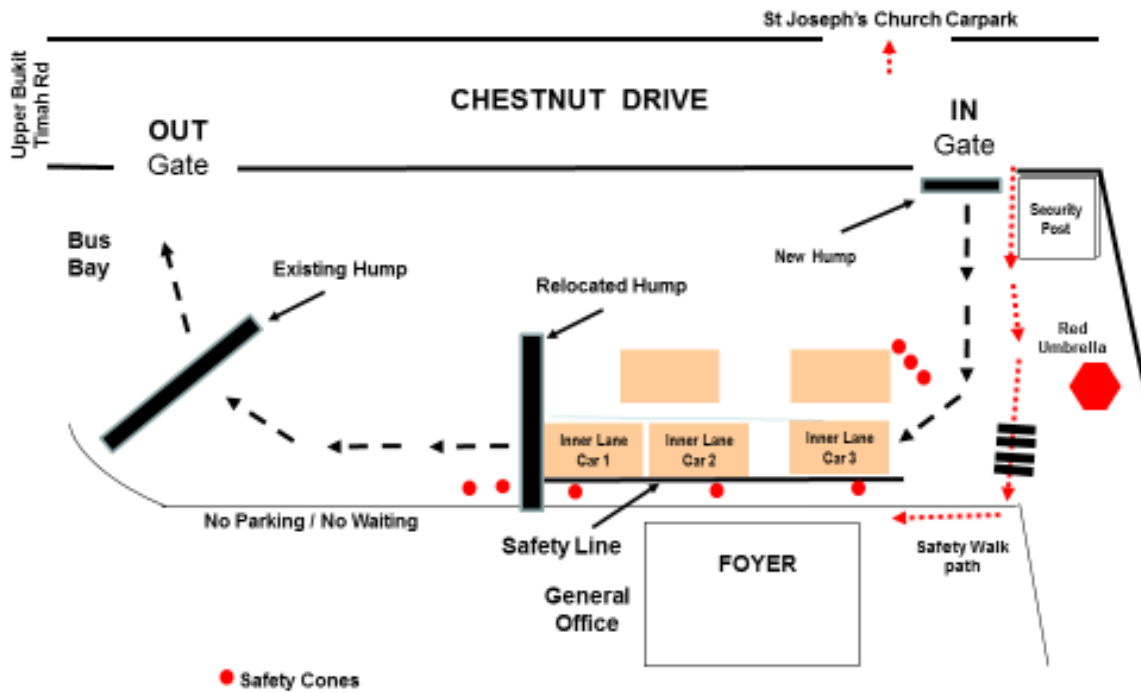
For those of you who drive into the school carpark for drop off and pick up, we are reiterating the changes that have been made during the road resurfacing works that were completed in 2018. A new hump was installed at the IN gate near the security guard post to ensure that all vehicles slow down to the **speed limit of 15 km/h** upon entering the school gate. The hump at the car porch was relocated to the end of the extended shelter so that the first car drop off point will be further up so as to allow passengers from 3 cars to alight at the same time. All drivers are reminded to keep a safe lookout for passengers alighting from the cars on the outer lane and to allow them to cross safely to the foyer. We seek your kind cooperation and support to be a good role models for your children by:

- being considerate in not blocking the side roads and entrance/exits of the residents' homes **especially at Chestnut Lane and Chestnut Terrace** as it might cause detrimental delay in case of an emergency;
- observing traffic rules by not parking illegally along Chestnut Drive;
- **reducing your speed to 15km/h** when you are near and in our school compound;
- **keeping a safe lookout for our girls as they alight and cross after drop-off each morning;**
- teaching your girls to take responsibility for their own safety by checking to ensure that cars have stopped before they cross the road;
- being considerate to other parents by moving forward to the first space near the relocated road hump so that more cars can park under the shelter to let the girls alight at the same time;
- teaching your girls to get ready to alight so that other parents do not have to wait too long at the porch;
- saying goodbye to the girls in the car so that both you and your girls will not be distracted and you can focus on the road and your girls can focus on the cars and the steps leading to the foyer;
- **being patient and giving way to the school buses or cars that need to filter to the left or right after drop off;**
- being patient when it rains and driving carefully. Any delay in getting to school on such days is understandable;
- driving into the driveway only after the school buses have left after 1.45pm to pick up your children/wards; and
- utilising nearby designated parking places in a responsible manner at all times.

As advised by LTA, instead of waiting for an accident to happen before we start to take this issue seriously, let us play our part to make the road safe for all road users. Please note there shall also be **strictly NO PARKING**, where applicable:

- 9 metres within a bus stop area;
- 6 metres within a junction;
- 3 metres within a fire-hydrant;
- 50 metres of a pedestrian crossing;
- On grass verge and footway; and
- At entrances or exits of any other premises.

*Parents who have made an appointment with the school staff can register at the Security Guard Post and proceed **ONLY** to the General Office.

Lunch Break: Parents/Guardians/Caregivers are not allowed to remain in the school canteen after 2.00pm.

A security guard will also be stationed at the pedestrian gate during the opening hours. Parents are to wait at the waiting area at the covered linkway for your daughter and to **use the pedestrian crossing to cross the road if your car is parked at the church carpark.** Please note however that the church carpark does not belong to the school and we appeal to you to park responsibly **ONLY** at the designated carpark lots.

We continue to emphasise the importance of safety to our students and constantly remind them to “**Think Safe, Feel Safe and Act Safe**” whether they are in school or out of school. As adults, it is important that we role-model the correct attitudes and behaviours to ensure safety of ourselves and others. Your partnership with us to ensure that the school and its environment is safe for all is of utmost importance.
