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Please take note of the information for this year:

## **A. ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS**

### **1. Arrangements for 2021 School Hours**

The school hours for 2020 are from **7.30am to 1.30pm from Monday to Friday.**

We would like all students to be on time for school every day. All students must attend the flag raising ceremony at 7.30am on school days. To avoid being late, we have arranged for pre-assembly activities which start at 7.20am daily to engage the students who arrive early in school.

For activities after school hours, such as Support Programmes (Primary 3 to Primary 6), Learning Support Programmes (Primary 1 & Primary 2), Enrichment Programmes and CCAs, students will report directly to their respective venues after their lunch.

### **2. Arrival Arrangements**

Morning assembly will begin promptly at 7.30 am. As the church carpark and gates will not be opened for public use, parents/guardians who drive will need to turn into the school driveway to drop your children/wards off. You are advised to avoid the peak hour congestion between 7.15 am and 7.25 am. Parents/Guardians who walk to school or take the public transport to school with their children/wards will stop outside the school gates and allow your children/wards to walk into the school on their own.

### **3. Safe Management Measures in the School**

In order to ring-fence and keep our school a safe place, and to prevent any potential spread of cases, we continue to depend on all parents, students and staff to uphold personal and social responsibility and integrity. **Students and staff should stay at home and NOT come to school if any household member is serving Stay-Home Notice (SHN), Home Quarantine Order (HQO) or Leave of Absence (LOA) in the same residence, or if an adult household member is on Medical Leave due to flu-like symptoms such as fever, cough, runny nose, sore throat and other respiratory issues.** We appeal to all parents/guardians to keep the school updated if applicable.

Schools will ensure that safe management measures are in place to keep our students safe:

- Daily temperature-taking with additional visual and question screening will continue to be carried out for all students and staff.
- Schools will clean high-touch surfaces more frequently and disinfect the premises daily.
- Students and staff are required to wear their masks or face shields.
- Students will practise frequent hand-washing throughout the school day and practise wipe down of tables and shared equipment after use.
- Intermingling across classes and levels will be minimised.
- There will be fixed exam-style seating in classrooms and spaced seating in canteens or alternative venues.
- Schools will also stagger dismissal and recess timings to reduce congestion.
- Minimise visitor presence and movement in the school premises.

### **4. Staggered Recess Timings**

In order to provide safe distancing measures in the canteen, the canteen tables have been re-arranged to maximise the available space in the canteen for the students. We have also made provisions for 6 staggered recesses to reduce congestion. We encourage parents/guardians to allow your children/wards to pack food for their recess break and snack time. Classes having recesses before 10.00 am will have a snack time at 12.00 noon and those having recesses after 10.00 am can have an earlier snack time at about 9.00 am.

#### 5. **Online Meet-the-Parents (MTP) Session (Primary 2 to Primary 6) via Zoom**

With the start of 2021, we would like to share our school's direction with all parents/guardians so as to help parents/guardians understand our school's future goals. The Principal, Year Heads (YHs) and Form Teachers will be conducting a Zoom Meeting with the parents/guardians of Primary 2 to Primary 6 students on Wednesday, 27 January 2021 from 3.00pm to 4.30pm.

Parents will know more about the programmes, expectations for each subject area, curriculum and assessment matters and form teachers will carry out a class dialogue session with parents. We hope to see you during the session. Details will be sent out nearer the date of MTP via Parents' Gateway.

#### 6. **Updating of Students' particulars (Primary 2 to Primary 6)**

We will also be asking parents of Primary 2 to Primary 6 students to update your child's particulars. The form will be issued by the Form Teacher on Monday, 11 January 2021. Please return the form to the Form Teacher by Friday, 15 January 2021.

#### 7. **Safety of our Students and Traffic Management at CHIJ OLQP**

The safety and well-being of our students, staff and stakeholders are of utmost importance. We seek the cooperation and support of all pedestrians, drivers/motorists entering our school compound to observe safety for self and others especially during arrival and dismissal times. We seek your understanding and cooperation to adhere to the directions and advice given for better traffic management and safety of all users. **Please refer to the important information in Annex 1.**

#### 8. **Bookshop Opening Hours for Parents**

We would strongly encourage parents/guardians to instil the virtues of responsibility and independence in your child/ward by getting them to purchase stationery items from the school bookshop on their own during their recesses. Alternatively, you can also purchase the items from other stationery shops or shopping malls. It is part of our safe management measures during this pandemic to minimize the number of visitors entering the school. If your child/ward is unable to purchase their stationery items or books on their own and you have to be present, please adhere to timeslots in the table below for the safety of our students. You will need to register at the security guard post and complete all the declaration, temperature-taking and SafeEntry requirements before being allowed to proceed to the bookshop.

#### 9. **Anti-Idling Engine Regulations**

Based on the media advisory released by NEA, parents who are waiting to pick their children from school need to switch off the engines of their cars while waiting. Through collective efforts by the school and NEA, we hope that in the new year, parents will continue to comply with the anti-idling engine regulations. Let us continue to work together to safeguard the public health of our students and our loved ones.

## **B. STUDENT MATTERS**

### **1. Virtue of Responsibility**

We have been teaching our students to exercise the virtue of responsibility and self-discipline in looking after their belongings. We encourage parents to assist us in helping your girls learn that they have to bring their own belongings to school. Thus, if your child/ward has called you and asked that you bring her belongings to school, please refrain from doing so. This will allow you to instil the virtue of responsibility in your child/ward.

We would also like you to note that students are not allowed to call their parents/ guardians during curriculum time. Calls can only be made during recess or after school. We would like to discourage parents/guardians from calling the General Office to pass messages to your child/ward. In the event of an emergency or a matter concerning your child's/ward's well-being, the teacher or an administrative staff will contact you.

### **2. 2021 HOMEWORK POLICY**

The Homework Policy aims to help students establish a healthy balance between commitments in school, after school and at home. Homework provides the opportunity for students to revise and reinforce concepts taught. This would also strengthen the home-school partnership by involving parents in the important role they play as partners in education.

#### **GENERAL GUIDELINES ON DAILY HOMEWORK**

The school seeks to ensure students' well-being by not overloading students with homework assignments. It adopts the following guidelines to manage the workload of students. The school and teachers have worked out an estimated amount of time that students would spend to complete their homework assignments daily, based on an average child's ability.

<b>Level</b>	<b>Estimated Time Spent on Homework Daily</b>
P1	30 minutes (emphasis on reading)
P2	30 minutes to 1 hour
P3	1 hour to 1 hour 30 minutes
P4	1 hour to 1 hour 30 minutes
P5	1 hour 30 minutes to 2 hours
P6	1 hour 30 minutes to 2 hours

Students who are unable to finish the work set in class will also need to complete it at home. In addition, students may be tasked to engage in reading activities or to write a journal at home.

### **3. Well-Being of Students**

We encourage all students to maintain a high standard of personal hygiene and to wash their hands with diligence. We would like to remind parents/guardians that if students are unwell and are showing flu-like symptoms, they should see a doctor and come to school when they are certified fit by the doctor. We encourage parents/guardians to provide the children/wards with a 'wellness pouch'. Items in this pouch could include their thermometers, tissue paper or wet wipes. They should also bring spare clean masks in a "Ziploc" bag in case their masks get soiled.

### **4. Birthday Celebrations in School**

We seek the understanding and support of all parents/guardians to note that birthday cakes are not to be brought to school for birthday celebrations. This is for the safety and well-being of our students as we note that some students may have food allergies, e.g. dairy products and nuts. Please also do not distribute goodie bags or other food items to your child's/ward's classmates.

## C. CURRICULAR AND CO-CURRICULAR MATTERS

### 1. Religious Education/Catechism Classes (for Catholic students)

As in the past, the school will be conducting Catechism classes for Catholic students at all levels. These lessons are aimed at helping students live the gospel values in their daily lives. Parents are reminded that Catholic students will need to attend Catechism classes in their respective parishes, as the Programme in the parishes specifically prepares children for the sacraments.

If your child/ward is a non-Catholic but you would like her to attend Catechism classes or Catholic events and activities, you may obtain a request form from your child's/ward's form teacher.

### 2. PAL for Primary 1 and Primary 2

PAL stands for Programme for Active Learning. It consists of modules of activities in the 4 domains, Sports and Games, Outdoor Education, Performing Arts (Music and Dance) and Visual Arts, which are carried out within the curriculum for all Primary 1 and 2 students.

### 3. CCA and Support and Enrichment Programmes

CCA sessions (for some CCAs) will begin on the **third week of Term 1, (Tuesday, 19 January 2021)**. More information to the girls concerned will be sent out in due course.

Support and Enrichment Programmes for Primary 3 to Primary 6 will also begin on the **fourth week of Term 1 (Monday, 25 January 2021)**. More information will be given to you through the Year Heads.

### 1. Schedule of Events for School

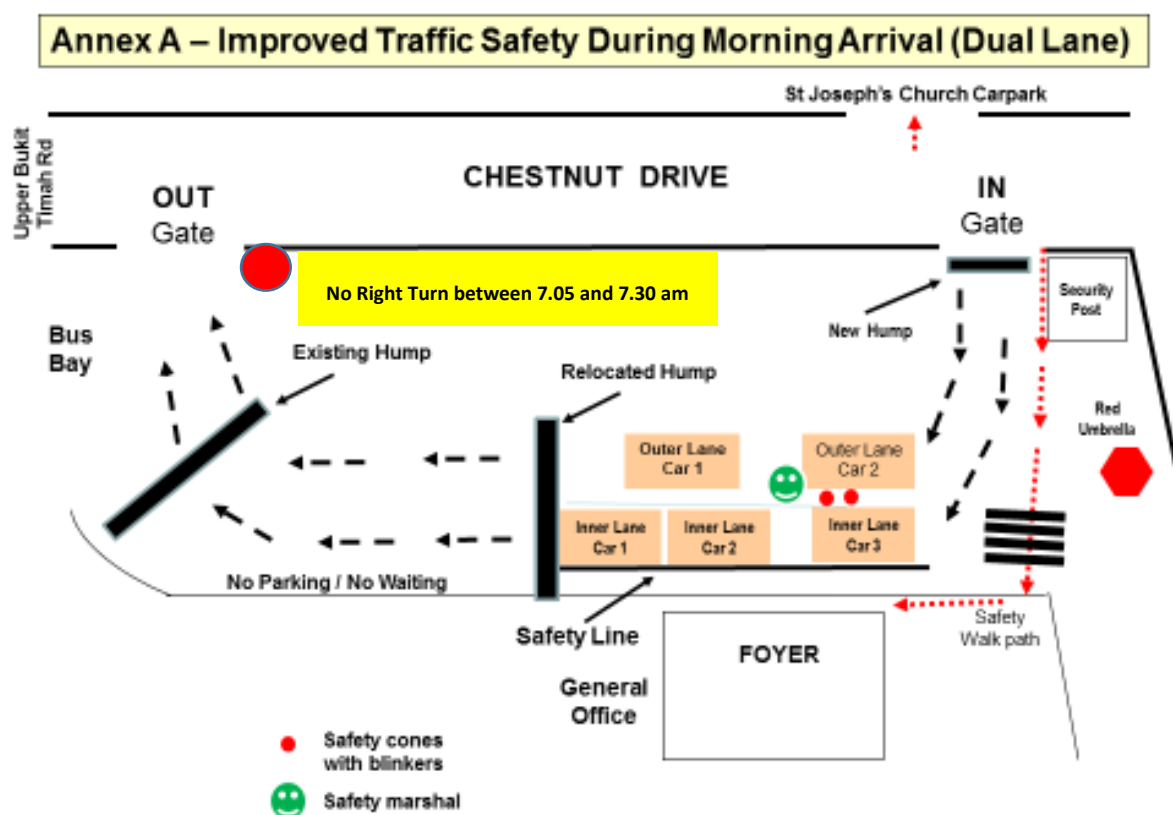

## ROAD SAFETY AND TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT AT CHIJ OUR LADY QUEEN OF PEACE AND ALONG CHESTNUT DRIVE

Our thanks and appreciation to the parents/guardians who have been supportive of our efforts to put the safety and well-being of our girls as our top priority. We thank you for your invaluable contribution in making traffic flow at our school smooth and ensuring the safety of the girls, our staff and including yourselves at the daily arrival and dismissal times.

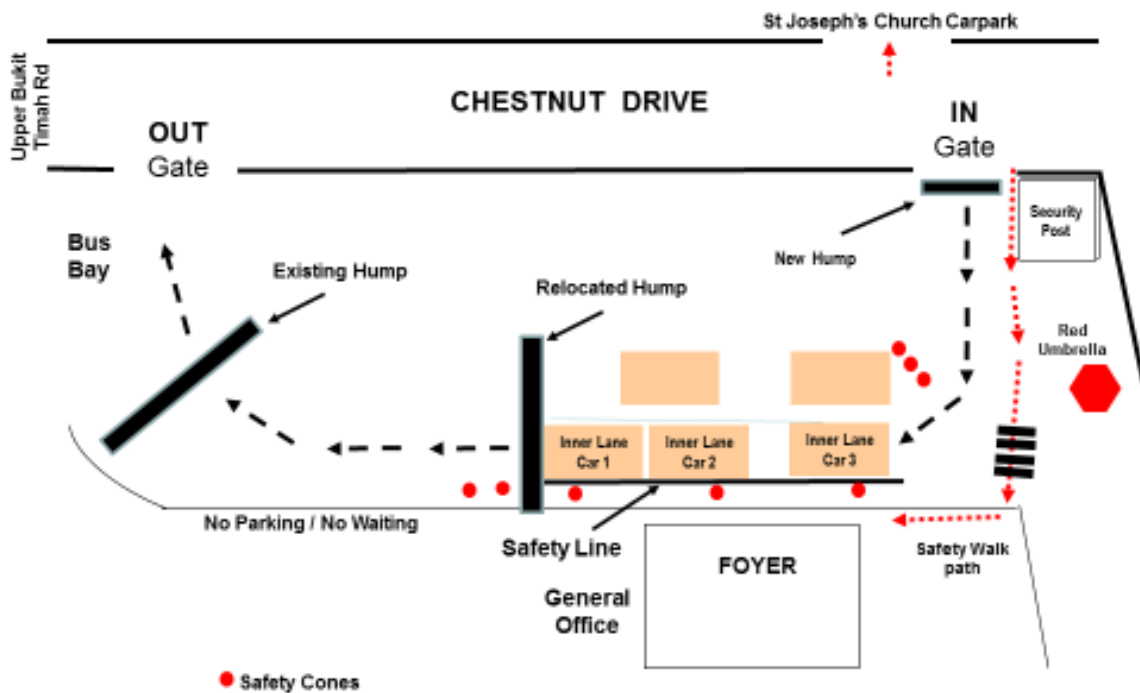
For those of you who drive into the school carpark for drop off and pick up, a hump was installed at the IN gate near the security guard post to ensure that all vehicles slow down to the **speed limit of 15 km/h** upon entering the school gate. The hump at the car porch was relocated to the end of the extended shelter so that the first car drop off point will be further up so as to allow passengers from 3 cars to alight at the same time. All drivers are reminded to keep a safe lookout for passengers alighting from the cars on the outer lane and to allow them to cross safely to the foyer. We seek your kind cooperation and support to be a good role models for your children/wards by:

- being considerate in not blocking the side roads and entrance/exits of the residents' homes **especially at Chestnut Lane and Chestnut Terrace** as it might cause detrimental delay in case of an emergency;
- being gracious by not sounding the honk, unless it is to avoid an accident;
- observing traffic rules by not parking illegally along Chestnut Drive;
- **reducing your speed to 15km/h** when you are near and in our school compound;
- **no cutting of lanes;**
- **keeping a safe lookout for our girls as they alight and cross after drop-off each morning;**
- teaching your child to take responsibility for their own safety by checking to ensure that cars have stopped before they cross the road;
- being considerate to other parents by moving forward to the first space near the relocated road hump so that more cars can park under the shelter to let the children alight at the same time;
- teaching your child to get ready to alight so that other parents do not have to wait too long at the porch;
- saying goodbye to the child in the car so that both you and your child will not be distracted; you can focus on the road and your child can focus on the traffic;
- **being patient and giving way to the school buses or cars that need to filter to the left or right after drop off;**
- being patient when it rains. Any delay in getting to school on such days is understandable;
- driving into the driveway only after the school buses have left after 1.45 pm (Primary 1 to Primary 3) and 1.55 pm (Primary 4 to Primary ) to pick up your children/wards; and
- utilising nearby designated parking places in a responsible manner at all times.



As advised by LTA, instead of waiting for an accident to happen before we start to take this issue seriously, let us play our part to make the road safe for all road users. Please note there shall also be **strictly NO PARKING**, where applicable:

- 9 metres within a bus stop area;
- 6 metres within a junction;
- 3 metres within a fire-hydrant;
- 50 metres of a pedestrian crossing;
- On grass verge and footway; and
- At entrances or exits of any other premises.
